## **Our Staff & Program**

At Zion Lutheran School, we take pride in our dedicated team of certified teachers, each holding qualifications in childhood education or their respective teaching fields. Our educators are committed to providing a high-quality Christian education that aligns with both state standards and the principles of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS).

As an accredited school, Zion Lutheran adheres to rigorous academic standards, ensuring that our students receive an education that is both spiritually enriching and academically strong. We strive to foster a learning environment where students can grow in faith, knowledge, and character under the guidance of our highly trained and compassionate staff.

## **Registration Policy & Admission Priority**

Zion Lutheran School is committed to providing a full-time Christian education in alignment with the teachings and practices of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS). As a ministry of the LCMS, all candidates for admission must acknowledge our doctrine and values.

Zion Lutheran School is a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization that welcomes students from both within our congregation and from the broader community. We accept students of all races, colors, nationalities, disabilities, and ethnic origins, ensuring equal access to all rights, privileges, programs, and activities offered by the school. We do not discriminate in the administration of educational policies, athletics, or other school-administered programs.

Parents must apply for each student annually. Admission is contingent upon the availability of an appropriate educational program that meets the needs of the student. While Zion Lutheran School does not have specialized facilities for students with significant learning differences, we assess each student on a case-by-case basis to determine the best educational environment for success. We reserve the right to deny admission if we cannot adequately meet a student's educational needs.

Zion Lutheran School reserves the right to evaluate students to determine their readiness for placement in the appropriate grade level.

It is the objective of Zion Lutheran School to provide full-time Christian education to as many children as possible. However, limitations of facilities and student needs dictate that a system of priorities is necessary. Students will be generally accepted in the following order:

1. Children in membership of Zion Lutheran Church.
2. Children in membership of other LCMS congregations.
3. Children already enrolled from the previous year or years prior and their siblings.
4. Children of community congregations that do not have a school.
5. Children of the community.

# Admissions Policy

Admission to Zion Lutheran is reliant on the availability of the appropriate educational program that fits the needs of the student. Zion Lutheran does not have specialized facilities or staff to cater to students with significant learning differences. Students will be assessed on a case-by-case basis to find the appropriate learning environment geared for success. Zion Lutheran reserves the right to deny admission to students that cannot be properly serviced in this educational setting.

## Enrollment Requirements for Returning Students

Parents must complete all registration requirements as provided by the administration. This includes submitting a copy of each child's birth certificate current immunization records or waiver, complete an online application that includes additional documentation. At the time of enrollment, parents are required to pay a \$99 application fee to hold their child's spot. This fee is non-refundable and will be applied toward offsetting static fees previously collected at Warrior Night. These fees include items such as the themed T-shirt, yearbook, assignment notebook, folders, and other required materials.

## Enrollment Requirements for New Students

Parents must submit a copy of each child's birth certificate, current immunization records or waiver, complete an online application, and complete a Home Language Survey. At the time of enrollment, parents are required to pay a \$99 application fee to hold their child's spot. This fee is non-refundable and will be applied toward offsetting static fees previously collected at Warrior Night. These fees include items such as the themed T-shirt, yearbook, assignment notebook, folders, and other required materials.

For new students enrolling in grades K-8, parents must complete the following steps below. No student may be completely enrolled until they complete all the steps.

### Step 1: Tour or Preview Night

### Step 2: Paperwork & Records

1. Complete online application for enrollment
2. Submit most recent report card
3. Submit most recent ILEARN and other standardized test records
4. Submit other educational records/testing from the school previously attended (This includes ISP's, IEP's, or 504 plans)
5. Submit behavior records from previous school
6. Enrollment is not considered final until the child's school records are received and reviewed by the school.

### **Step 3: Assessment**

All new students will be assessed prior to admission.

### **Step 4: Meeting with the Admissions Committee**

Before acceptance, the parent and student must meet with the Admissions Committee to discuss the student's academic goals, faith journey, and school expectations. This meeting ensures a strong partnership in Christian education and a successful transition into Zion Lutheran School.

Decisions made by the Admissions Committee is final.

Please understand payment is expected by the 15th of each month from June to May. I understand that my balance and information is posted and updated on Zion's online information system, Skyward. Any balance that exceeds two month's tuition will suspend your child's attendance at Zion Lutheran School until the balance is paid in full.

### **Indiana Choice Scholarships**

Indiana Choice Scholarships, commonly referred to as school vouchers, provide financial assistance to eligible families in the state of Indiana to help cover the cost of private school tuition for those who may not be able to afford private schooling otherwise. Starting in the 2026-2027 school year, Choice will be universal for all families. However, legislation does not go into effect until July 1st. Therefore, we will still need to collect tax documentation as requested.

### **Community Partner & Helping Hands Scholarship**

If you are a part of the community, you can receive up to a \$500 scholarship. To receive a Helping Hands scholarship, families need to turn in their 2025 tax returns. This scholarship is needs based and amounts range in size due to need.

# Curriculum

Zion offers a Christ-Centered, Bible-based education in a family-atmosphere that builds trust, loyalty, and camaraderie among our students. Zion Lutheran uses an accelerated curriculum that is accepted by the state of Indiana and approved by the Lutheran Schools of Indiana. Students are taught above the State Standards and Guidelines of the College and Career Ready Standards for the State of Indiana. Below is a brief overview of our curriculum at each grade level, if you would like additional information, please contact our admissions director.

Zion Lutheran is accredited by the National Lutheran School Accreditation. This is an accepted accreditation by the State of Indiana. Yearly upgrades and benchmarks are met and exceeded to maintain accreditation status.

Our highly qualified teachers are committed to providing education that will challenge students to impact the world for Christ. Students will be challenged spiritually, academically, socially, and physically in the classroom and through extracurricular activities.

## **Kindergarten - 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade**

Our Kindergarten program provides a solid foundation for your child's future education while providing a safe, encouraging, and intellectually stimulating Christ-centered environment. Our first & second grades are built to increase each child's academic skills to their highest levels. Our staff and teachers work together to foster an environment of learning and fostering the development of a personal relationship with Jesus Christ.

## **3<sup>rd</sup> Grade - 5<sup>th</sup> Grade**

In grades 3-5, students develop independence, responsibility, and organizational skills as they transition from early education to intermediate learning. Third graders focus on self-reliance, cooperative learning, and using a daily planner to stay organized. In fourth grade, students continue to build study skills and strengthen their relationship with God while becoming more independent.

## **6<sup>th</sup> Grade - 8<sup>th</sup> Grade (Middle School)**

Fifth grade prepares students for middle school with a strong academic foundation in subjects like religion, music, and physical education, while fostering social and emotional growth. Throughout these years, teachers work to create an engaging and supportive environment for all students. Our middle school curriculum offers a well-rounded educational experience, combining core subjects like Religion, Mathematics, Science, Language Arts and Social Studies. Students engage in hands-on learning, project-based activities, and both teacher-led and independent work across subjects. From Bible study and Confirmation classes to comprehensive Math and Science instruction, our program fosters academic growth while developing essential skills in reading, writing, and communication. With a mix of traditional methods and innovative resources, students are prepared for success both inside and outside the classroom.

## **Additional Initiatives**

At Zion we offer a wide variety of education offerings and modern learning experiences. We are always working to expand our opportunities to our students with current technology and media, music, and faith-based courses.

## **Dress Code**

At Zion Lutheran School, we believe our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, and our appearance should reflect respect and decency. Students' personal appearance plays a key role in their attitude and success at school. Clothing should be clean, in good repair, and not contain holes. Hairstyles should not distract from the learning environment, and clothing should not display un-Christian or inappropriate messages.

The uniform policy includes:

**Uniform Tops:** All tops must be purchased from the approved provider and feature the Zion logo. These include polo-style tops, sweatshirts, and classroom tops. This provider will be provided at Warrior Night each year.

**Uniform Bottoms:** Pants and shorts must be khaki, chino, or dress pants style, in colors such as navy, black, gray, brown, or khaki. Shorts must be fingertip length, and pants should fit properly at the waist with no fraying or holes. Leggings and running tights are not acceptable. Jeans are only allowed on designated days.

## **Technology at Zion**

Students in grades Kindergarten through 8th will have access to technology. Zion Lutheran School will provide students with iPads for educational purposes. Zion is a 1 to 1 device school and utilizes Google Classroom and Apple Schools technology.

All students and parents have signed a Responsible Use Policy detailing the expectations of technology use in the admission packet at the beginning of each school year.

Zion Lutheran uses an internet-filtering system to monitor student activity and provide for student safety. Any repairs or replacement of the school-owed device due to misuse or damage is the responsibility of the parent.

## **Warrior Night**

Zion Warrior Night is a mandatory event for all K-8 students and their parent or guardian, completing the enrollment process and providing essential back-to-school information. During this event, families will learn about the lunch program, required vaccinations, before and after-school care, incidental fees, technology usage, music class opportunities, and the PTL schedule. You'll also have the chance to purchase uniforms and special items.

## Lunch

The lunch account balance cannot exceed an overdue amount of \$20.00 per child. Free/reduced lunch forms to be provided before school begins.

## Health & Safety Initiatives

Our teachers and staff members undergo thorough training in key areas, including child development, safety protocols, first aid, and CPR. We provide regular professional development opportunities to ensure that staff remain informed about the latest best practices in early childhood education, health, and safety.

Additionally, staff receive ongoing training in emergency response procedures, conflict resolution, child abuse prevention, and infection control. We believe in fostering a culture of continuous learning, where staff are equipped with the knowledge and skills to handle a variety of situations and respond to the needs of each child. By prioritizing staff training, we ensure that every child in our care is supported, safe, and provided with the highest standard of care.

## Drop-off & Pick-up Procedures:

As mentioned, and stated above, the safety and security of your child are our top priorities. To ensure a smooth and secure arrival and departure process, we ask that all children be dropped off and picked up by an authorized adult.

During pickup we follow procedures to ensure that children are only released to authorized individuals. This system helps us create a secure environment while building trust and open communication with our families. If someone other than the usual pick-up person will be coming for your child, just let us know ahead of time, and we'll make the necessary arrangements. You will be able to provide us with your authorized persons during the registration process.

## Parent Communication

We value strong communication with parents to support student success. We use multiple channels to keep families informed and engaged in their child's development.

Our **Student Information System (SIS) or SKYWARD** provides parents with access to updates, progress reports, and direct communication with teachers. For immediate needs, parents can contact us directly via email or phone.

We also use the **Remind app** for real-time notifications about school events, closures, and reminders, ensuring timely updates are easily accessible.

Effective communication is key to our program's success. By leveraging these tools, we strengthen our partnership with families and ensure they stay informed and involved in their child's learning.

## Extended Care Options

We are pleased to offer an extended care program to support your family's needs before and after school. Our before and after-school care provides a safe, nurturing environment where children can relax, socialize, and participate in fun, engaging activities. Whether it's working on homework or creative play and projects, our extended care staff ensures each child is cared for with the same love and attention as during school hours.

Starting with the 2026-'27 school year, we are introducing a subscription-based extended care program. This flexible approach allows you to use the program as needed, without having to worry about the length of time your child stays during before or after school care. Whether it's for a short or extended period, you can customize your child's care to fit your family's schedule.

- Students who are picked up past the times stated are subject to a late fee of \$1 per minute past the pickup time.
- Each student receives one (1) grace day per semester if they need to attend before or aftercare due to an exigent circumstance.
- Our family discount starts with the second student in the care program, offering a 10% discount. After the second student, there is no additional charge for any further children from the same family.
- We do offer a 3% discount for extended care that is paid in advance in full for the school year. Payment for the entire school year is due before August 1.
